- 1. Call to order Bill Howe called the meeting to order at 4:06 PM.
- 2. Approval of the Agenda Carrie Mitchell moved that the agenda be approved. Seconded by Kathy Goldberg. Carried.
- 3. Minutes of the 2011 Annual General Meeting Minutes were used projected on the screen and attendees were given the chance to read over the minutes. Hayley Leschert moved to approve the minutes. Seconded Geoff Parker. Carried.
- 4. Business arising from minutes Michelle Pisoni spoke to the Greater South becoming a region.
- 5. Budget Submission 2012-2013 (Vic Mensch)
- 5.1 Treasurer's Report/Financial Statements Vic Mensch spoke to the Treasurer's Report. Vic Mensch moved to accept the 2010/2011 statements as audited by the Alberta Teachers Association. Seconded by Barbara-Lynn Goodwin. Carried.
- 5.2 Consideration of the budget Vic Mensch spoke to the budget and the over expenditure that will occur of the next few years to reduce the surplus to an allowable level. This has been another very busy school year for me, as I am sure it has been for others.

As past-president, I have completed the following:

- Beginning Teachers Conference Along with Hayley Leschert and Geoff Parker, presented on the topic of High School ELA. This was such a pleasant experience and I will definitely do it again if possible (October Report).
- Submitted recommendation that ELAC pursue a confirmation from the membership regarding the value of Alberta Educations "Text Selection Project" and that a project such as this would be well worth reinitiating in the future (October Report).
- Attended ATA-Alberta Education joint symposium, Encountering Curriculum Redesign Bring Inspiring Education to Life (January Report).
- Received and promoted this year's ELAC Honorary Membership Award for Barbara Proctor-Hartley (January/March Report).
- Prepared recommendations for the ELAC handbook pertaining to the awards and to the new council position of *Communications Coordinator* (March Report).

In completing my final term as outgoing past-president of the ELAC council, I would leave you with my final reflections. For those who know me, you will likely have noticed that during the past five years on the ELAC executive council, I have been driven by one primary motivation: advocacy. I believe that advocacy is ELAC's most important mandate. With the growth of internet resources available to teachers in an instant, what ELAC offers that is thus far unavailable in any other form or forum, is the opportunity to speak for the English language arts teachers and students from across the province and raise the level of awareness of issues and concerns unique to our subject area. The continued erosion of the status of our subject area and the supports teachers receive for all the additional work that goes into preparation and assessment of ELA outcomes, demands our attention. For the many who, because of their remote location or lack of financial support, are unable to make it to meetings or professional development sessions, ELAC should provide, perhaps through our newly designed website, a sense of community and a collective voice. It was with that expectation that the majority of the 120 new members in the previous year joined this council. As the province moves towards a new curriculum, this role will become more important than ever. I can only hope that in the years to come, ELAC will continue to take up such a challenge.

#### Faculty of Education undergraduate program:

We will begin to implement our new undergraduate program in the fall of 2013; the plan was to have the program fully implemented starting in Fall 2015. However, due to recent cuts to postsecondary education, our faculty is in the process of examining ways to address the huge budget cuts. Some changes to the new program are inevitable. The Language and Literacy Subject Area Committee will do all it can to secure the 4<sup>th</sup> year language and literacy course which we see as a strong improvement to the Elementary Program (and which took a long time to have approved).

#### Department of Elementary Education on-line MEd program:

We are recruiting for the new Department of Elementary Education on-line MEd program with a specialization in Curriculum and Pedagogy. The 10-course specialization will start in September of 2013. The Online Master of Education offers:

#### Research Project, Engaging Teachers with Canadian Literature for Social Justice:

Ingrid Johnston is working with a group of secondary teachers and I am working with a group of elementary teachers on a national study designed to examine possibilities for teachers to develop curricula and pedagogies for diverse classrooms through collaborative teacher inquiry groups. Our study is exploring ways in which researchers and teachers can collaboratively develop strategies for selecting, reading and teaching a range of contemporary Canadian literature in classrooms and reflect upon students' responses to the issues raised by the texts.

#### Canadian Centre for Research on Literacy (CCRL):

I was honoured to be awarded the CCRL fellowship for 2013. The research that I will conduct for the fellowship is for a study examining educators' understandings of English language variation. Specific research questions ask:

- 1) What do teachers believe about English language variation and communication?
- 2) How can teachers be supported to acquire a more inclusive and expansive view of English?
- 3) In what ways do teachers' views of English language variation limit or facilitate Aboriginal students' access to academic language and school literacy?

#### Canadian Indigenous Languages and Literacy Development Institute (CILLDI):

CILLDI (pronounced 'sill-dee') hosts an annual summer school held at the University of Alberta, and is dedicated to the revitalization of Canada's Indigenous languages through documentation, teaching, and literacy. Our purpose is to support individuals at the community level by providing basic training in linguistics, native languages, second language teaching, and other aspects of professional enhancement such as language-related research and policy making.
